

THE HOME

Inspired by colonial American architecture, this Buderim home offers its own twist on the Hamptons style with abundant natural light streaming in through the double-storey windows, which overlook the pool. The elevated, leafy outlook is complemented by natural finishes such as dry stack stone, American oak floors, white mahogany decking and a wood-burning fireplace.

RETRO REVIVAL

Mosaic Construction's Peregian Beach property wowed the judges in the Renovations/Addition category. The Lorikeet House was awarded the number one gong in the category, taking home the project of the year title.

A SNAPSHOT:

Lorikeet House is a complete renovation and substantial extension to a Peregian Beach house.

The home had a strong spatial quality in the main upper-floor living areas and simple geometric forms in the existing house. It also offered a strong connection with the beach environment immediately to the east. These factors were the major drivers in the decision to keep the existing building largely intact and simply surround the structure with new contemporary and complementary building forms.

A series of simple connected box-like masses were used in the new works, which allow an understated integration of the home into the existing streetscape and protection from the western summer sun.

The beach facade of the building remains dominated by the form of the existing '70s beach house, with a contemporary deck and pavilion extension to the northern side.

The main challenge in this project was the creation and integration of the substantial new areas of the home. It was important to respect and retain the feeling of the existing home, and as such careful attention to all thresholds when moving from one part of the building to another were painstakingly considered and detailed.



PELICAN WATERS HOME WITH A DIFFERENCE

Planet Homes is no stranger to accolades, having secured a total of 17 awards in the past six years. And now, the group has yet another under its belt, after the company won the Display Home of the Year title at this year's HIA awards for its Pelican Waters property.

Planet Home's Jason Bowker says winning the award was a proud moment.

The home is built around tropical internal garden courtyards, and has an integrated pool, a comprehensive outdoor kitchen, generous outdoor living decks and patios and a huge log-fired feature fireplace.
